### **Guides By Region**

Wyoming Parent Guides have journeys as varied and individualistic as your personal experience. Our guides have first-hand experience and knowledge of raising a child with a hearing loss from different perspectives. Guides have children with all levels of hearing loss from mild, moderate, severe, to profound or unilateral (one ear) hearing loss. Some have kids that were diagnosed with a hearing loss at birth, while other Guides' children were diagnosed months or years after they were born, which is known as late onset hearing loss (LOHL).

Our Guides also have experience with Microtia/Atresia; a congenital deformity where the outer ear is underdeveloped, and atresia is the absence or closure of the outer ear. Other Guides are raising a child with other disabilities along with hearing loss, known as Deaf Plus. The communication options they have choose for their child is also varied: hearing aids, cochlear implants, bone conducting hearing aid (BAHA), the use of sign language-American Sign Language - ASL, Signing Exact English -SEE, conceptually signed English.
