Brief Summary

In today's world, the transparency of social media has us exposed to more than ever before. This informs our culture, communication, interactions and our exposure to traumatic experiences. We are exposed through videos and photos to things that we previously read about. Our brains are dealing not only with our own but others' traumatic experiences every day. This onslaught of exposure reminds us as professionals in mental health of the prevalence of trauma in all our lives. We are seeing increased need for Trauma Informed Care, understanding secondary exposure and its impacts on us, along with human to human connections. Through discussion of the principles in Trauma Informed Care, and by using examples from Deaf cultural experiences, we will identify strategies of how practitioners can work to incorporate cultural sensitivity into TIC, and how we can all become more open to the varied experiences of the people we work with in this field.

Lisa works with individuals with developmental disabilities to promote as much independence as possible. She currently works to collaborate with, educate and support individuals, families and agencies in Albuquerque and surrounding areas.

Lisa contracts with Division of Vocational Rehabilitation to support Deaf individuals staying in school or in the work force. She has been trained in Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR), Trauma Informed Care, and continues to make her practice Client-Centered. Lisa loves to travel and work with others to build awareness of the possibilities, capabilities of Deaf people, as well as bring groups together to collaborate and learn from each other.
